posting on Blackboard?



Assume that a work is copyrighted unless otherwise indicated (e.g., by a CC license).

Other exceptions are laws, decrees, government regulations and works that are no longer copyrighted (expires 70 years after death of author).

Creative Commons?

A CC license allows the author of a work to specify the conditions under which his or her work may be distributed.

There are 4 conditions that when combined yield 6 licensing options:

From Attribution-only as a condition to

Attribution-Non Commercial-No Derivative Works

Author yourself? Student author?

If you yourself are the author of the work, and you created it in the course of performing your job, then the copyright most likely lies with NHL Stenden. See the <u>publication policy</u> for this.

Is the student the author? If so, the student has the copyright, unless agreed otherwise. Therefore, to

post a student's work on Blackboard, permission from the student is required.
